## The Tuckston

April 2024

The General Conference of the United Methodist Church is the only body that can speak on behalf of our entire denomination. The General Conference meets every four years and is a gathering of United Methodists from all over the world who come together to decide important issues for our church. Among those issues are the administrative issues of budgets and organization, but also issues of our visioning for our larger church and establishing our priorities as a church. It is time for General Conference to be held once again, this time in Charlotte from April 23-May 3.

As United Methodist in North Georgia, we will be represented by a delegation of 22 persons, half of whom are clergy persons and half of whom are lay persons, which have been elected by our Annual Conference. Dr. Byron Thomas, District Superintendent of the Central-South District, is the leader of our delegation. There are 862 total delegates to the conference.

This leads to questions of what issues are scheduled for discussion. One of the issues will be regionalization. We are a worldwide church; however, we work in different contexts around the world. Our work here at Tuckston with our friends in Brazil and with the water project in Burundi is certainly evidence of that. Essentially, if approved, our worldwide church will be divided into regions allowing for more flexibility for our denomination.

Another issue that will be discussed is a revision of our Social Principles. A full-scale revision has not taken place in regard to the principles since 1972. The General Conference will also deal with issues of making sure our clergy pension system is stable going forward to provide a more equitable retirement for all our clergy. Of course, other petitions and issues will come forward and there is no way to predict exactly what will come from this meeting.

Please allow me a word of personal commentary. There will be a lot of news coverage emanating from General Conference. Please be cautious in reading reports from General Conference in the secular press or other unofficial sources. The North Georgia Conference website will provide updates and information in an accurate and balanced way. I will also answer to the best of my ability any questions that may arise. In as much as the conference is reasonably close, I plan on attending for a couple of days if my schedule permits. Above all, please be in prayer for the coming General Conference as our denomination continues with its mission of "Making Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World."


